

## State Primaries – September 9, 2014

Polls opened at 7:00 a.m. on a nice but cool partly sunny late summer day. Temperatures were in the upper 60's. Polls closed at 8:00 p.m.

At the opening of the polls and before any ballots were cast, the Ballot Box register indicated 000 and the box was opened to see that it was empty; and at the close of the polls the Ballot Box register indicated 205. The Automark machine was set up and operational but was not used by any voters. The total number of ballots included 3 democratic absentee ballots and 1 republican absentee ballot. There were no UOCAVA voters. Two permanent absentee voters who were unenrolled chose not to vote in the election when asked to declare a party. The ringer on the ballot box failed to sound a few times but at the end of the evening the voting lists and the ballot box equaled indicating that the ballots were counted. There was one voter given a Republican ballot when they were registered as a Democrat. The voter did not bring this to the attention of the election workers until after the ballot was cast in the ballot box. The officers in charge of the voting lists counted and announced the whole number of names checked on said lists to be 205. The number of Democratic voters on the lists were 168. The number of Republican voters on the lists were 37. The presiding officer then removed the ballots from the box and caused them to be counted one by one, and announced the whole number of ballots cast as 205. The number of Democratic ballots removed from the ballot box was 168 and Republican ballots 37. The ballots having been duly sorted and counted were recorded and declared in open meeting to be as set forth in the official record. Count completed at 9:00 p.m. Ballots were sealed in a plastic tote with 2 security strips marked 0329007 and 0329048 along with two paper stickers. Canvas of votes:
