#### SPECIAL TOWN MEETING TOWN OF WHATELY April 10, 2021

Pursuant to the recorded warrant a special town meeting of the Town of Whately held outside at the Whately Town Offices, 4 Sandy Lane was called to order Saturday, April 10, 2021 at 1:00 p.m. by Moderator Nathanael Fortune. 21 voters were checked in. Because of the COVID-19 outbreak, social distancing was adhered to and the meeting was recorded by FCAT.

# ARTICLE 1: Upon motion made and seconded, it was

Voted that the Town appropriate and transfer the sum of \$50,000 from the Water Department Enterprise Fund – Retained Earnings to pay for upgrades to the water system at the main pumphouse on Chestnut Plain Road.

Moderator declared the article passed unanimously

### ARTICLE 2. Upon motion made and seconded, it was

Voted that the Town appropriate and transfer the sum of \$5,000 from the Water Department Enterprise Fund – Retained Earnings and authorize payment in that amount for the reimbursement of a water system hook-up fee for property no longer anticipated to be connected to the system.

Moderator declared the article passed unanimously

## ARTICLE 3. Upon motion made and seconded, it was

Voted to transfer the sum of \$99.67 from available Funds (FY20 Free Cash) the amount due to Comcast from a prior fiscal year and to authorize payment in that amount.

Moderator declared the article passed unanimously

## ARTICLE 4. Upon motion made and seconded, it was

Voted to authorize the Selectboard to petition the General Court for special legislation to allow Edwin Zaniewski, a Town of Whately police officer, notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary, to serve in such position until the age of seventy, or until the date of his retirement or non-appointment, whichever occurs first; provided that no deductions from the regular compensation of said Edwin Zaniewski, shall be made under G.L. c. 32 subsequent to his reaching the age of sixty-five in connection with his service to the Town for retirement or pension purposes; and further provided, that the General Court may make clerical and editorial changes of form only to the bill unless the Selectboard approves amendments to the bill prior to enactment by the General Court, and to authorize the Selectboard to approve such amendments which shall be within the scope of the general public objectives of the petition.

Moderator declared the article passed unanimously

Motion was made to adjourn without date at 1:07 p.m. – Vote was unanimous.
