State Primaries – September 6, 2022

EARLY VOTING

Early voting in person was held at the Town Offices, 4 Sandy Lane and began on Saturday, August 27, 2022 and ended on Thursday, September 1, 2022. Early voting was available by mail as well as in person. 225 Early vote by mail ballots were requested by voters and 113 voters returned their ballots. 29 voters voted in person over the specified in person early voting period. Voters checked in with the Clerk, each was given a ballot and an early voting envelope. Voters voted their ballot, completed the affirmation on the envelope and inserted the ballot in the envelope and returned the ballot to the Clerk. Ballots were held in a collection envelope and at the end of each early voting session ballots were processed in VRIS and stored in a bin which was sealed each night and kept in the vault. A poll pad was used to check in early voters in person.

The listing below shows early voting hours, numbers of votes cast, and the numbered strips that were used to seal the ballot box each day. Each morning the Automark voting machine was checked to assure it was operating correctly. Test ballots were stored in a spoiled ballot envelope in the bin with the early votes.

Election Day – September 6th, 2022

The State Primary was held on Tuesday, September 6th at the Whately Town Hall, 194 Chestnut Plain Road from 7 a.m. – 8 p.m. The weather was cool and rainy.

Before the election all unvoted ballots were counted. Democratic ballots included 500 Official Ballots, 300 Absentee/Early Ballots, and 50 Automark ballots. Republican ballots included 400 Official Ballots, 100 Absentee/Early Ballots and 50 Automark ballots.

There were 1242 registered voters including inactive voters. One UOCAVA voters were sent democratic ballots and one were returned.

At the opening of the polls and before any ballots were cast, the Ballot Box register indicated 000; and at the close of the polls the Ballot Box register indicated 344. Included in this total were 113 early vote by mail ballots, 29 early vote in person ballots, 4 absentee ballots, and 198 voters voted in person on election day. The officers in charge of the voting lists counted and announced the whole number of names checked on said list to be 344. The number of Democratic voters on the list was 273. The number of Republican voters on the list was 71. The presiding officer then removed the ballots from the box and caused them to be counted one by one, and announced the whole number of ballots cast as 344. The number of Democratic ballots removed from the ballot box was 273 and Republican ballots 71. The ballots having been duly sorted and counted were recorded and declared in open meeting to be as set forth in the official record. Count completed at 9:30 p.m. Voted ballots were sealed in a plastic tote with 2 security strips marked 0190261 and 0190271 along with 1 signed paper sticker. Unvoted ballots were sealed in a separate tote and secured with strip # 0190264 and 0190250. Early voting and Absentee envelopes and spoiled and test ballots were stored in a bin and secured with strips 0190261 & 0190271. There were five inactive voter who completed an Affidavit of Current and Continuous Residency with proper identification.
