

The National 9/11 Memorial & Museum

Come Join First Choice Tours as we set sail to the "Big Apple" for this remarkable tour! There is no rest stop going into the city. Our journey will begin with lunch on your own before heading to Ground Zero and the Museum.

The Birth of a City and a Country New York traces its rich history to Midtown & Lower Manhattan, the meeting point of the Hudson River and the East River. Originally named Nieuw (New) Amsterdam, New York City began as a small Dutch settlement in what is now known as Lower Manhattan. Broadway, which was then called Heere Straat (Gentleman Street), was nothing but a small road. Wall Street actually had a wall back in 1653 to protect the settlers from attacks. As the city grew, so did the nation. New York was the first capital of the United States and the spot where George Washington was inaugurated is marked by his statue. Over the years, Lower Manhattan has become the financial capital of the world. Today, the streets are teeming with people and filled with stories of New York's past, present and future. We head over to the National 9/11 Memorial and Museum. A 16-acre site of unparalleled heroism. The 9/11 Memorial consists of two massive pools set within the original footprints of the Twin Towers with 30-foot waterfalls cascading down their sides. Next, we have included a visit to the all new museum located within the archaeological heart of the World Trade Center site. This museum tells the story of 9/11 through multimedia displays, archives, narratives and a collection of monumental and authentic artifacts. This is a self-guided tour and you can stay at the museum for several hours! This is one journey which will leave you with lasting memories! Don't forget your camera! Please get something to eat before leaving the city, as there will not be a stop on the way home! We can't wait to spend the day with you!
