And you are directed to serve this Warrant, by posting up attested copies thereof at the Whately Town Offices, Town Hall, Post Office and S. White Dickinson Memorial Library in said Town, seven days at least before the time of holding of said meeting.

HEREOF FAIL NOT, and make due return of this Warrant, with your doings thereon, to the Town Clerk, at the time and place of meeting, as aforesaid.
