



LESURE, SAMUEL, from Warwick, came in 1828. He built the house and his store, about 1850, on the east side of Chestnut Plain street, near the site of the John Crafts house.


In 1830 Levi Bush was appointed postmaster, and in 1841 he was succeded by Samuel Lesure who occupied the office from that year, with the exception of four years that Dennis Dickinson held the office, until his advanced age compelled his resignation, after which his daughter. Mrs. Samuel B. White, was appointed. She attended to the principal office work, while Mr. Testice continued to pass out the stail, until his memory of faces and names seemed to fade away. 



Potential Research Pitfalls

- Not all sources are 100% accurate.
- Spelling of names can change over time.
- Confusion over two people with the same name.
- Roads may be renamed
 - Claverack to State Road
 - Straits Road to Long Plain Road
 - part of Chestnut Plain to North Street
- Streets are renumbered.

But it's still fun and worthwhile.
